ADDED SHOW! CAL PERFORMANCES AT UC BERKELEY PRESENTS BASSEM YOUSSEF THE JOKE IS MIGHTIER THAN THE SWORD TUESDAY, APRIL 4

Berkeley, February 23, 2017 — Cal Performances presents Egyptian political satirist <u>Bassem</u> <u>Youssef</u> in *The Joke is Mightier Than the Sword,* Tuesday, April 4, at 8pm in Zellerbach Hall. Following the 2011 Egyptian revolution, the former cardiothoracic surgeon found a new career as a television star through his Egyptian news satire series *Al-Bernameg (The Show)*, as well as the digital series *The Democracy Handbook*, which follows Youssef as he examines American politics while journeying across the US. In his talk on April 4, which will be interspersed with video clips and imagery, Youssef will chronicle how his experience with the Egyptian Revolution and role in the Arab Spring led him to become the satirical voice of the region. Youssef will participate in a question-and-answer session with the audience immediately following his presentation. His new book, *Revolution for Dummies*, will be published by HarperCollins on March 21. <u>Tickling Giants</u>, a feature film about Youssef's life and creative, non-violent ways to stand up to abusive powers that limit free speech, premieres in New York on March 15 and in Los Angeles on April 7.

About Bassem Youssef

Bassem Youssef, dubbed the Jon Stewart of the Arab World, was a practicing cardiothoracic surgeon in his native Egypt when the Egyptian populist revolution upended the country in 2011. Then on the verge of leaving Egypt to resettle in Cleveland to take a new job as a surgeon, he instead became the creator and host of the popular television show *Al-Bernameg (The Shon)*, the first political satire show in the Middle East. Originally a five-minute program shot in Youssef's laundry room and posted on You'Tube days after the protests in Tahrir Square unseated Egypt's ruling elite, *Al-Bernameg* became the most-watched show across the region, with 30 million viewers every week. Throughout its three seasons, *Al-Bernameg* remained controversial for its hilarious and bold criticism of the ruling powers. Accused of being "anti-Islam" and insulting the president of Egypt, Youssef was arrested and interrogated before being released on bail. In spite of achieving unprecedented high ratings in its final season, in June 2014 Youssef announced the program's termination due to overwhelming political pressures on the show and the airing channel.

In 2013 Youssef was named one of *Time*'s 100 Most Influential People and was awarded the International Press Freedom Award by the Committee to Protect Journalists. In 2015, Youssef served as a resident fellow at the Institute of Politics at Harvard's John F. Kennedy School of Government, and in the same year, he hosted the International Emmy Awards. He has been a guest multiple times on *The Daily Show* with Jon Stewart, who has called Youssef his hero and said to him: "I do know a little something about the humor business; your show is sharp, you're really good on it, it's smart, it's well executed; I think the world of what you're doing down there." Youssef's 10episode digital series *The Democracy Handbook* satirizes American culture—guns, immigration, elections—from his distinctive point of view as a recent Egyptian immigrant to this country. His new book, *Revolution for Dummies*, will be published by HarperCollins on March 21. He is currently a fellow at Stanford University, and resides with his family in the United States.
