Pina Bausch was born in 1940 in Solingen, Germany. In 1955, she began dance studies at the Folkwang School in Essen, Germany, with Kurt Jooss as director, and graduated from there in 1958. She received a scholarship for the German Academical Exchange Service to the United States, and was a special student of The Juilliard School in New York. Ms. Bausch danced with the Paul Sanasardo and Donya Feuer dance companies, and was a dancer with the New American Ballet and the Metropolitan Opera. In 1962, she returned to Germany and danced with Folkwang-Ballett, newly founded by Kurt Jooss. Starting in 1968, Ms. Bausch's choreographic works entered the repertoire of the Folkwang-Ballett; one year later, she became artistic director of the company. In 1973, Pina Bausch became director and choreographer of the newly founded Tanztheater Wuppertal.

Besides her own pieces, in 1982 she performed in Federico Fellini's film And the Ship Sails On. Additional projects include Die Klage der Kaiserin (The Complaint of the Empress) (1990), a film directed by Pina Bausch; the staging of the choreography for Le sacre du printemps (The Rite of Spring) (1997) for the Ballet de L'Opéra National de Paris; director of the opera Herzog Blaubarts Burg (Duke Bluebeard's Castle) (1998) by Béla Bartók for the Festival International d'Art Lyrique d'Aix-en-Provence under the musical direction of Pierre Boulez; performing in Pedro Almodóvar's film Talk to Her with excerpts from Café Müller and Masurca Fogo by Pina Bausch (2001). In 1998, Pina Bausch celebrated for the first time "Ein Fest in Wuppertal," with friends and artitsts from all over the world marking the 25th anniversary of the Tanztheater Wuppertal. In October 2001 and 2004, Pina Bausch again directed her own Festivals. In 2005, she staged the choreography for Orpheus und Eurydike with the Ballet de L'Opéra National de Paris.
