CAL PERFORMANCES AT UC BERKELEY PRESENTS

A Maria Manetti Shrem Great Artist Performance

CHICAGO SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA CONDUCTED BY RICCARDO MUTI

SATURDAY, JANUARY 17, 2026 AT ZELLERBACH HALL Berkeley, CA, December 8, 2025—Cal Performances at UC Berkeley welcomes the return of the distinguished **Chicago Symphony Orchestra** and its revered Music Director Emeritus for Life, Maestro **Riccardo Muti**, for one concert only on Saturday, January 17 at 8pm at Zellerbach Hall. The performance is the sole Bay Area stop on the orchestra's seven-city West Coast tour and marks its much-anticipated return to Berkeley since Muti and the orchestra made their Cal Performances debut during the 2017–18 season.

Known for his mastery of Brahms' repertoire, Muti opens the concert leading the orchestra in the composer's towering Fourth Symphony, his last and arguably greatest symphonic work. It is followed by Stravinsky's suite from the ballet *The Fairy's Kiss*, based on a Hans Christian Anderson fairy tale. The expansive program concludes with Ravel's much-loved *Boléro*, an exploration of a single rhythm and two closely related melodies.

Founded in 1891, the Chicago Symphony Orchestra is recognized as one of the greatest orchestras in the world. Muti served as its tenth music director for 13 years, developing an uncanny rapport with the musicians and creating what is widely considered one of the most successful pairings of orchestra and conductor in modern times. Under his direction, the orchestra has been praised for its balance of passion and power, and—as *San Francisco Chronicle* critic Joshua Kosman wrote of the 2017 Berkeley performances—"a striking blend of expressive nuance and sheer sonic force." At the beginning of the 2023–24 Season, Muti became Music Director Emeritus for Life, and his close relations with this group of musicians continues to this day.

In addition to his famed artistic partnership with the orchestra, Muti is much admired for his command of repertoire past and present with the Chicago Symphony, he has conducted 18world premieres and released 12 recordings on the CSO Resound label, winning four Grammy Awards among them.
