CAL PERFORMANCES AT UC BERKELEY PRESENTS THE SCOTTISH BALLET

IN THE WEST COAST PREMIERE OF TENNESSEE WILLIAMS'

A STREETCAR NAMED DESIRE

A Page & Stage book club event will take place in conjunction with the performances on May 11

Berkeley, April 4, 2017 — Cal Performances concludes its diverse season of dance performances with the West Coast premiere of Scottish Ballet's award-winning production of <u>A Streetcar</u>

Named Desire, Wednesday–Friday, May 10-12 at 8pm in Zellerbach Hall. Based on Tennessee

Williams' Pulitzer Prize-winning play—which celebrates its 70th anniversary this year—the ballet is a collaboration between theater and film director Nancy Meckler and choreographer Annabelle

Lopez Ochoa, with a jazz score commissioned from **Peter Salem**. These performances mark Scottish Ballet's first visit to the West Coast in six years.

In Tennessee Williams' Southern Gothic melodrama, fading southern belle Blanche DuBois moves into her sister Stella's New Orleans apartment, trying to leave behind her troubled past. Stella's brutish husband Stanley senses that Blanche is not what she appears to be, and sets out to destroy her. Director Meckler and choreographer Lopez Ochoa offer a unique take on the classic tale, delving into Blanche's past to provide expanded context for her eventual downfall. Meckler and Lopez Ochoa's collaboration yields a dance-theater hybrid that depicts the physical desires and psychological distress of the play's characters, balancing the grace and elegance of ballet with the grit and raw emotion of Williams' play. The production premiered in 2012, and in 2013 won the Critics' Circle National Dance Award (Best Classical Choreography) and the South Bank Award for Dance in the UK.

In conjunction with the performances, a *Page & Stage* book club event will take place on Thursday, May 11 at 6pm at the Musical Offering Café in Berkeley. Dance dramaturg **Carrie Gaiser Casey** and ACT theater dramaturg **Michael Paller** will lead a conversation about the artistic choices involved in translating a literary work into the language of dance. Tickets are \$5, and include one free non-alcoholic drink.

About Scottish Ballet

Over its 48-year history, Scottish Ballet has been acclaimed for performances of a broad range of repertoire, including both classical and contemporary works—seminal pieces from the 20th-century modern ballet canon; signature dances by living choreographers; new commissions from contemporary choreographers; and story ballets re-imagined with fresh relevance for a contemporary audience. The company performs across Scotland, the UK, and abroad, with strong classical technique at the root of all of its work. Scottish Ballet's awards include the 2008 Critics' Circle Award for Outstanding Repertoire (Classical) and nominations for Outstanding Company at the Critics' Circle Awards in 2009 and 2010.

Nancy Meckler, artistic director for Shared Experience Theatre, has previously directed for the National Theatre and Royal Shakespeare Company, among others, on Broadway and in London's

West End. She has also directed two feature films, *Sister My Sister* and *Alive and Kicking*. **Annabelle Lopez Ochoa** is an award-winning choreographer who has created works for more than 40 dance companies, including Dutch National Ballet, the Royal Ballet of Flanders, and Joffrey Ballet.
