CAL PERFORMANCES AT UC BERKELEY PRESENTS EIGHTH BLACKBIRD PERFORMING FIVE BAY AREA PREMIERES INCLUDING A NEW WORK BY PAMELA Z, PIONEERING BAY AREA SOUND ARTIST & VOCALIST SATURDAY, DECEMBER 14 IN ZELLERBACH PLAYHOUSE

Berkeley, November 7, 2019 — Cal Performances at UC Berkeley presents Chicago's award-winning new-music ensemble Eighth Blackbird in a concert of nine contemporary works, including five Bay Area premieres, with works by next-generation composers Nina Shekhar, Viet Cuong, Fjóla Evans, and Holly Harrison, and by San Francisco composer, performer, and electronic musician Pamela Z. Pamela Z joins the ensemble for the first Bay Area performance of her new work, Ways of Looking, which explores the musicality of speech sounds; she will also

perform two solo works, *Quatre Couches* and *Badagada*. Eighth Blackbird performs in Zellerbach Playhouse on Saturday, December 14 at 8pm.

Pamela Z has described Ways of Looking, which was commissioned by Eighth Blackbird, as a "sonic portrait" of the ensemble. She interviewed the six members of the ensemble to create the piece, which combines live acoustic performance with a fixed media track and a vocal part that she performs and processes live. As Pamela Z has described, "I meticulously selected sentences, phrases, words, syllables, and phonemes to create sonic building blocks for the piece. This work is in four movements, and each movement focuses on sounds or concepts culled from those interviews." The four other local premieres on the program take their inspiration from a range of sources. Australian composer Holly Harrison's short, energetic Lobster Tales and Turtle Soup (2016) is inspired by Lewis Carroll's Alice's Adventures in Wonderland. Nina Shekhar's ice 'n' SPICE (2018) conjures the sensations of the spicy Indian food she ate as an Indian-American child; and Canadian/Icelandic composer Fjóla Evans' Eroding (2017) explores the process of erosion of the glacial river Hvítá in Iceland. American composer Viet Cuong's Electric Aroma (2017) is a propulsive, distorted tango inspired by the poetry of Pablo Picasso.

Eighth Blackbird, founded in 1996, has won four Grammy Awards and has been a recipient of a MacArthur Award for Creative and Effective Institutions. The sextet's "Pierrot" instrumentation in Berkeley features Nathalie Joachim, flutes; Matt Albert, violin; Matthew Duvall, percussion; Zachary Good, clarinets; Nick Photinos, cello; and Lisa Kaplan, piano. Good and Albert are currently performing with the ensemble during vacancies in those positions.

A pre-performance talk is planned at 7pm in Zellerbach Playhouse, with pianist Sarah Cahill and pianist/composer Myra Melford, a professor in the UC Berkeley Department of Music. This event is free to concert ticket holders.
