Berkeley, October 1, 2020 — Cal Performances at UC Berkeley presents Manual Cinema performing *Frankenstein* in a virtual premiere that will begin streaming on Thursday, October 29 at 7pm (PDT). The performance is one of 16 new, professionally produced full-length performances in the *Cal Performances at Home* performing arts streaming series. The recording of a new performance will premiere each week beginning October 1, 2020 through January 14, 2021. On the evenings of each streaming premiere, a special digital "watch party" will feature a participatory live chat element. CONTENT: Video of a conversation between Drew Dir, co-artistic director of Manual Cinema, Carol Christ, UC Berkeley Chancellor, moderated by Cal Performances executive and artistic director Jeremy Geffen will be live beginning one half-hour before the streaming premiere. Chancellor Christ, who has lead the university since 2017, is a Victorian literature scholar by training and is teaching a freshman seminar "Frankenstein and Its Rewritings" this semester.

By the time Manual Cinema's performance premieres on October 29, the *Cal Performances at Home* library of offerings will feature performances streamable on demand by violinist Tessa Lark and pianist Andrew Armstrong, the Tetzlaff Quartet, Nathalie Joachim and Spektral Quartet, and Darcy James Argue's Secret Society.
