Berkeley, October 8, 2020 — Cal Performances at UC Berkeley presents the Matthew Whitaker Quartet in the premiere of a virtual jazz set that will begin streaming on Thursday, November 5 at 7pm (PST). The performance is one of 16 new, professionally produced full-length performances in the *Cal Performances at Home* performing arts streaming series. The recording of a new performance will premiere each week through January 14, 2021. On the evenings of each streaming premiere, a special digital "watch party" will feature a participatory live chat element. WHO

Keyboardist Matthew Whitaker is a once-in-a-generation musical talent. Blind since age two, Whitaker holds court on piano and Hammond B-3 organ, with a bold and confident sense of swing and a wide-ranging palette that spans straight-ahead jazz and hard bop, R&B, and Latin influences. Now 19-years-old, he has been performing across the globe since age 11—even opening for Stevie Wonder at the Apollo Theater—and at 13, he became the youngest musician to be endorsed by Hammond in the company's history. He has just released his second recording, *Now Hear This*, a collection of original music and arrangements of works by Ahmad Jamal, Charlie Parker, Eddie Harris, Michel Camilo, Billy Strayhorn, and more.
