BERKELEY, December 20, 2008—Expect the unexpected when Australia's world-renowned Circus Oz comes to celebrate its 30th Birthday Bash! at Cal Performances Thursday-Saturday, February 5-8. Since 1978, Circus Oz has brought its "simultaneously laid back, satirical, funny, slightly naughty, chaotic and richly musical" (New York Times) performances to audiences of all ages. Its November 2007 appearance in Cal Performances had critics demanding that the troupe "come up from Down Under more often" (San Francisco Chronicle). Circus Oz features "no animals, no scary clowns, no cheesy music (but proper rock'n'roll) and no women in abbreviated costumes just for the hell of it. Instead they gave us outstanding skill, wit, invention, innovation and beauty" (The Times, London). The troupe combines contemporary acts of physicality and humor as well as the more traditional acts of juggling, tightrope walking, human pyramids, and contortionism. The madness of this troupe's death-defying feats, Aussie humor and original live music will be a feast to the eyes, ears and funny bone.

Circus Oz will give a *SchoolTime* performance for Bay Area students Friday, February 6 at 11:00 a.m. in Zellerbach Hall. Tickets available in advance only.

Currently headed up by artistic director **Mike Finch** and senior circus artist and founding member **Tim Coldwel**, Circus Oz was formed in 1978 when two smaller independent circuses, Soapbox Circus and the New Circus, merged. Circus Oz debuted in the same year at the Adelaide Festival. By 1980 Circus Oz had begun to tour internationally. The first tour traveled to Papua New Guinea, Holland, Belgium, London, Norwich, Bath and Chichester. During the middle of the 1980s, Circus Oz trained with China's Nanjing Acrobatic Troupe, building their repertoire and adding acrobatic skills such as pole climbing and hoop diving to the circus. Circus Oz has performed across five continents and in more than twenty-six countries including

spots as diverse as New York City, a refugee camp on the West Bank, indigenous communities in the Australian desert and a glass opera house in the Brazilian rainforest. Performances have been given in dozens of languages. Circus Oz broke the box office records at the Edinburgh Fringe Festival and has represented Australia at many other international festivals.

While there have been a few hundred different performers working with Circus Oz over the years, there are still founding members with the company today. This combination of new imagination and talent with the original culture and spirit of Circus Oz allows it to reinvent itself year after year without losing sight of the troupe's original aspirations of gender equality, collaboration, humanity, social justice and a good time for all.
