IRISH THEATER COMPANY <u>DRUID</u> BRINGS THE CONTEMPORARY COMIC MASTERPIECE <u>THE CRIPPLE OF INISHMAAN</u>, WRITTEN BY <u>MARTIN MCDONAGH</u> AND DIRECTED BY <u>GARRY HYNES</u>, TO CAL PERFORMANCES AT ZELLERBACH PLAYHOUSE MAY 4-14

BERKELEY, April 4, 2011—*The Cripple of Inishmaan*, a "fiendishly funny sendup of rural Irish life" (*Washington Post*), performed by the Galway-based theater company **Druid**, comes to Cal Performances for a two week engagement **May 4–14**. Directed by Druid founder and Tony Award–winner **Garry Hynes** and written by Tony Award–winning playwright **Martin McDonagh**, *The Cripple of Inishmaan* will perform in Zellerbach Playhouse **Wednesday** through **Sunday**, **May 4--8** and **Tuesday** through **Saturday**, **May 10--14**.

The Cripple of Inishmaan is set in 1934 on the Irish island of Inishmaan, one of three Aran Islands. The play tells the story of the odd, disabled boy Billy Claven, also called Cripple Billy, who—like all the eccentric, hard-luck, storytelling characters in town—gets excited when a Hollywood moviemaker comes to the neighboring island of Inishmore to film a documentary. This background story is true—the resulting documentary film, Robert J. Flaherty's "Man of Aran," is today considered a classic of the genre—and McDonagh's imagining of what went on behind and off the scenes is both funny and gut-wrenching. "*The Cripple of Inishmaan* is a must see. It's brilliant, gripping drama, hilarious, thoughtful, and sometimes genuinely scary" (*DC Theatre Scene*).

The production is on a five-month, nine-city, coast-to-coast tour of the United States as part of Imagine Ireland, a year-long season of Irish arts in the United States, supported by Culture Ireland. This is the company's third visit to Berkeley. The *San Francisco Chronicle* called last season's *The Walwarth Farce*, a production that was "extremely funny and distressing with almost every breath - or gasp" (*SF Chronicle*).

DRUID

Garry Hynes, **Mick Lally**, and **Marie Mullen** founded **Druid** in Galway, Ireland, in 1975. The three graduates of the National University of Ireland, Galway wanted to establish the first professional theater company in Ireland based outside of Dublin. Since its founding, Druid has presented both classic dramatic works and challenging new plays, many of which it commissioned. The company, whose official website is www.druidtheatre.com, has had two artistic directors in its history: Garry Hynes (1975–91 and 1995 to date) and Maeliosa Stafford (1991–94).

Druid's history of presenting the plays of **Martin McDonagh** goes back to February 1, 1996, with *The Beauty Queen of Leenane* by the then-unknown playwright. The production went on to worldwide acclaim, culminating in four Tony Awards in 1998. (Garry Hynes, who directed the play, was the first woman to receive a Tony Award for Best Director.) McDonagh's subsequent plays, A Skull in Connemara and *The Lonesome West* (which with *Beauty* became known as the Leenane Trilogy), were produced over the next five years and played in 31 venues on three continents. The company's production of *The Cripple of Inishmaan* premiered in 2008, played throughout Ireland and in several UK venues, and had a three-month, sold-out, off-Broadway run in New York.

The cast for Druid's production of *The Cripple of Inishmaan* in Berkeley will be **Ingrid Craigie** as Kate; **Dearbhla Molloy** as Eileen; **Dermot Crowley** as Johnny Pateen Mike; **Tadhg Murphy** as Billy Claven; **Laurence Kinlan** as Bartley; **Clare Dunne** as Slippy Helen; **Liam Carney** as BabbyBobby; **Nancy E. Carroll** as Mammy O'Dougal; and **Paul Vincent O'Connor** as Doctor McSharry.

MARTIN MCDONAGH

Irish playwright **Martin McDonagh** appeared on the theater scene in 1996 when Druid presented his first play, *The Beauty Queen of Leenane*. The production went on to success on two continents and four Tony Awards. Over the next decade, McDonagh wrote several more plays, including 2003's *The Pillowman*, which *The New York Times* called a "spellbinding stunner of a play." In 2005 McDonagh wrote and directed *Six Shooter*, which won the Oscar for Best Live

Action Short Film. McDonagh's next film, *In Bruges*, told the story of two hit men hiding in a sleepy Belgian town and won the 2009 British Academy of Film and Television Arts award for Best Original Screenplay and was nominated for the Oscar for Best Original Screenplay. McDonagh's most recent play, *A Behanding in Spokane* (2010), starred Christopher Walken, Sam Rockwell, and Anthony Mackie in its New York run and was described as "a perfect, demented marriage of character and environment" (*The New York Times*).

McDonagh's *The Cripple of Inishmaan* has won high praise, including this rave from *The Boston Globe*: "So you laugh, you wince, you laugh again, you wince again. Mostly, you admire the playwright's skill at populating the stage with nine characters who are indelibly rooted in the particularities of time (1934) and place (an island off the west coast of Ireland) while also ranging across a wide spectrum of human nature, in all its variegations and contradictions."
