BERKELEY—Cal Performances and Classical 102.1 KDFC present the popular weekly classical music program From the Top Thursday, May 29 at 8:00 p.m. at Zellerbach Hall. The show features pianist and host Christopher O'Riley working and performing with the next generation of talented young musicians. Together, with humor and a lack of pretension, they demonstrate to audiences around the country that classical music is for everyone, not just the privileged few. "It's classy reality programming," says NBC's The Today Show. .

The program, to be taped live in front of an audience at Zellerbach Hall, will be broadcast nationally on more than 250 stations at a date to be announced. Locally the program can be heard on Sundays at 7:00 p.m. on 102.1 FM KDFC. Distributed by NPR, the radio program reaches 750,000 listeners each week and showcases pre-college age soloists and ensembles. In addition to O'Riley, the show features announcer Joanne Robinson and a group of young "roving reporters" including Tojah Coleman-Jones, Hayley Goldbach, Emily Mayer and Caeli Smith.

From the Top, a non-profit organization, provides a platform for young artists to present themselves, share their passion and develop into inspirational peer role models. In addition to the radio program, the organization produces television, web and education programs and brings young performers to schools and community centers. From the Top web-based audio and video archives form the basis of lesson plans distributed every week to over 100,000 teachers.

Past *From the Top* programs have featured Debussy's *Arabesque No. 1* played by an 8-year-old pianist from San Diego; a performance of Bottesini's *Tarantella* by a 17-year-old double-bass player from Iowa; a traditional slack-key guitar piece by a 14-year-old Hawaiian; and Schumann's Piano Quintet in E-flat Major with student musicians, pianist O'Riley and special guest, violinist **Nadja Salerno Sonnenberg**.

From his groundbreaking transcriptions of Radiohead to his unforgettable interpretations of classic and new repertoire, pianist **Christopher O'Riley** has redefined the possibilities of classical music. He has taken his unique vision to both traditional classical music venues and symphonic settings, as well as to entirely new audiences on the radio, at universities and even clubs. An interpreter and arranger of some of the most important contemporary rock music of our time, O'Riley lives by the Duke Ellington adage, "There are only two kinds of music: good music and bad." As a classical pianist, O'Riley has toured and appeared with the world-famous Academy of St. Martin in the Fields Chamber Orchestra, the Los Angeles Philharmonic, the Minnesota Orchestra and the Pittsburgh Symphony.
