GARRISON KEILLOR, BRINGS HIS KEEN OBSERVATIONS ON LIFE TO ZELLERBACH HALL FOR AN EVENING OF STORYTELLING TUESDAY, FEBRUARY 12 AT 8:00 P.M.

BERKELEY, January 7, 2008—Award-winning writer, satirist, actor, singer and composer Garrison Keillor brings his distinctive take on life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness to Zellerbach Hall on Tuesday, February 12 at 8:00 p.m. Keillor, one of the country's foremost raconteurs, is best known as the creative genius behind the radio mega-hit *Prairie Home Companion*, heard weekly by over three million listeners on more than 450 public radio stations. Author of a dozen books, his newest, *Pontoon: A Lake Wobegon Novel*, was published September 2007. "Only the most skillful literary hands should attempt the combination of flat-out farce and genuine emotion; Keillor...is up to the job" (*The New York Times*). In Berkeley, Keillor's solo performance promises to be a free-wheeling collection of stories, some familiar and some new, exhibiting his trademark humor.

Keillor was born in 1942 in Anoka, Minnesota, and began his radio career as a freshman at the University of Minnesota, from which he graduated in 1966. He went to work for Minnesota Public Radio in 1969, and on July 6, 1974, he hosted the first broadcast of *A Prairie Home Companion* in St. Paul. The show ended in 1987, resumed in 1989 in New York as *The American Radio Company*, returned to Minnesota, and in 1993 resumed the name *A Prairie Home Companion*.

Keillor's most recent role included playing himself in the movie adaptation of his show, *A Prairie Home Companion* (2006). The film features Meryl Streep and Lily Tomlin as the singing Johnson sisters, Lindsay Lohan as Streep's daughter, Woody Harrelson and John C. Reilly as singing cowboys Lefty and Dusty, Kevin Kline as Guy Noir and Tommy Lee Jones as the Axeman, who is dispatched by the radio station's new corporate owners in Texas to shut down the show.

He is also the author of twelve books, including *Lake Wobegon Days* (1985); *The Book of Guys* (1993); *The Old Man Who Loved Cheese* (1996); *Wobegon Boy* (1997); *Me: By Jimmy "Big Boy" Valente As Told to Garrison Keillor* (1999); *Love Me* (2003); and 2004's *Homegrown Democrat*.

Keillor has received numerous awards, including a Grammy Award for his recording of *Lake Wobegon Days*. He has also received two Cable ACE Awards and a George Foster Peabody Award. He is a member of the American Academy of Arts and Sciences, and recently was presented with a National Humanities Medal by the National Endowment for the Humanities. In 1994, he was inducted into the Radio Hall of Fame at Chicago's Museum of Broadcast Communications.

With conductor and choral director Philip Brunelle, he has performed with many orchestras, including the Chicago, Milwaukee, San Francisco, Pittsburgh, Minnesota, Dallas, and National symphonies. He has appeared at Wolf Trap, Carnegie Hall, and other major concert halls as a member of The Hopeful Gospel Quartet, and he has performed on his own in one-man shows across the country and on tour broadcasts of *A Prairie Home Companion*.
