BERKELEY, October 15, 2008—Celebrating 30 years of touring in the United States, the award-winning Golden Dragon Acrobats return to Zellerbach Hall Friday, November 28 at 8:00 p.m.; Saturday, November 29 at 2:00 p.m. and 8:00 p.m.; and Sunday, November 30 at 3:00 p.m. Founder and director Danny Chang, along with choreographer/costume designer Angela Chang, creates "colorful ways to use [the troupe's] skills and take advantage of their apparent total lack of fear" says *The New York Times*. The Golden Dragon Acrobats combine astounding acrobatics with theatrical techniques and Chinese traditional dance featuring contortionists, tumblers and jugglers in breathtaking acts like the bicycle pagoda and the traditional Chinese Lion Dance. "Accompanied by a musical score of traditional Chinese music filtered through a New Age sensibility" (*The New York Post*), the engagement promises to be a tasty holiday treat for the eyes, ears and nerves.

Touring the United States continuously since 1978, the Golden Dragon Acrobats hail from Cangzhou, Hebei province, in the People's Republic of China. Its 25 members are athletes, actors and artists who have studied and trained for their craft since early childhood. The group has performed in all 50 states and in over 65 countries around the world. The Golden Dragon Acrobat troupe had its Broadway debut at the New Victory Theater in 2005, and was nominated for two Drama Desk Awards for the performance. Danny Chang is one of the world's leading promoters of Chinese acrobatics. He began his training at the age of eight with his family's acrobatic school in Taipei, and began performing with the Golden Dragon Acrobats at age ten.

He is the recipient of many awards, including the prestigious Medal for International Faith and Goodwill by the Republic of China's Coordination Council for North American Affairs.

The longest-running folk art form in history, the Chinese acrobatic tradition dates back more than two thousand years. Chinese acrobatics originated from movements and props common in the everyday life of working people, which later evolved into a form of performance. Eventually, acrobatic performances caught the attention of emperors, leading to the popularization of the art form. Thousands of years later, this ancient art lives on as an example of the rich cultural traditions of China.
