PACO DE LUCIA

One of the world's greatest living guitarists of any genre, **Paco de Lucía** is a hero of modern flamenco, having created a fusion style influenced by jazz, stretching and embellishing flamenco's strict structure, but remaining true to the soul of its Gypsy, Muslim and Jewish roots. His phenomenal technique—diamond sharp with lightening velocity—has astounded audiences for decades. Since his Carnegie Hall debut in 1970, when he was crowned the reigning monarch of flamenco guitar, Paco de Lucía has performed internationally to "standing room only" crowds.

Paco de Luciá has made over 30 recordings and soundtracks, with his most recent *Cositas Buenas* due for release in late January 2004.
