JAZZ PIANIST, VOCALIST AND SONGWRITER PATRICIA BARBER BRINGS HER UNIQUE SOUND TO CAL PERFORMANCES SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 29 AT 8:00 P.M.

BERKELEY, August 30, 2007—Chicago-based jazz pianist, singer and songwriter

Patricia Barber brings her sharp intelligence and dramatic musical skills to Wheeler

Auditorium on Saturday, September 29 at 8:00 p.m. Barber, whose "intricate, ruminative

works" (TIME Magazine), 2003 Guggenheim Fellowship, and tireless touring have made her a

critical, intellectual and audience favorite, will perform works from Mythologies, her 2006 album

of songs based on characters from Ovid's Metamorphoses. "The expressive range of this music

proves thrilling, even though all of it clearly derives from a single sensibility: the spare,

sometimes austere jazz idiom that long has been Barber's forte," wrote the Chicago Tribune.

Backing her up are her longtime musical cohorts guitarist Neal Alger, drummer Eric Montzka

and bassist Michael Arnopol.

Barber has spent some fifteen years developing a singular sound and an international

following. She has toured often and released nine highly original and critically acclaimed

albums since 1989, including Café Blue, Modern Cool, Nightclub, Verse, and Live: A Fortnight

in France. She is "the most fearless, most intellectually stimulating and, by extension, most

interesting singer-songwriter-pianist on the American jazz scene" (*JazzTimes*).

Barber's voice has been described by *DownBeat* as a "noir, conspiratorially whispered

alto" and she sometimes comes across more street-smart than book-smart. She applied for and

received a Guggenheim Fellowship in 2003 to focus on the Ovid-themed song cycle—a project

that had been on her mind since she saw playwright Mary Zimmerman's adaptation of

Metamorphoses. It was the first and only grant she has ever applied for. Past Guggenheim

recipients have included writer Noam Chomsky, poet e.e. cummings, and composer Aaron

Copland. Jazz musicians rarely get Guggenheim Fellowships, and Barber was the first popular songwriter to receive one. She used the grant, and the time off from touring it gave her, to create *Mythologies*, a song cycle based on characters from Ovid's *Metamorphoses* including Morpheus, Pygmalion, Phaethon, and Persephone. Barber's *Mythologies* has provoked critical acclaim and much discussion in the jazz world.

Barber's performance in Berkeley is part of an extended stay, precipitated by her receiving the University's prestigious Townsend Resident Fellowship. This multi-disciplinary fellowship is intended to bring to the Berkeley campus persons (not necessarily academics) with whom faculty and students might not otherwise have direct or sustained contact. Barber's residency in the Music Department at Berkeley begins fall 2007.
