## The Peking Acrobats

The Peking Acrobats have been diplomats of their spirited culture for decades, leaving audiences around the world awestruck. From as early an age as five the hand-selected performers begin training to master acrobatic disciplines that arose during the Ch'in Dynasty more than 2,200 years ago, a period when the movements developed to reflect everyday life. In modern times, the

troupe is the largest of its kind and performs under the direction of **Hai Ken Tsai**, whose family is steeped in three generations of Chinese acrobatics. Together with live accompaniment from an exotic Chinese orchestra, the Acrobats transform 2,000-year-old traditions of agility and grace into a modern-day kaleidoscope of entertainment and wonder. Acrobats spin plates atop sticks while performing all manner of mind-boggling contortions. Unicyclists balance atop umbrellas. Jugglers use eggs, cannon and soccer balls.
