CAL PERFORMANCES PRESENTS THE ZEHETMAIR QUARTET SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 11 AT 5:00 P.M. IN HERTZ HALL

BERKELEY, October 8, 2007 – Recognized as one of the most exciting string quartets today, the Zehetmair Quartet comes to Cal Performances Sunday, November 11 at 5:00 p.m. at Hertz Hall. The group, founded by the violinist Thomas Zehetmair, is comprised of Zehetmair, Kuba Jakowicz (violin), Ruth Killius (viola), and Ursula Smith (cello). Hailed by the London Times as "full-blooded and raw... bold and magical," the Zehetmair Quartet is renowned for performing keen interpretations of oft-described obscure works by Bartók and Schumann, among others, entirely from memory. From their first recording of Bartók's 4th and Hartmann's 1st string quartets, for which they won the Quarterly Prize by the Deutsche Schallplattenkritik, the quartet has been dedicated to maintaining the integrity of a piece in the manner that the composer intended, rehearsing only one program per year and looking strictly to original manuscripts of compositions. As is Zehetmair's preference, the program at Cal Performances mixes older and newer works, including Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart's Quartet in G major, K. 156 (1772-73); Paul Hindemith's Quartet No. 4, Op. 22 (1921); and Robert Schumann's Quartet No. 1 in A minor, Op. 41 (1842).

THOMAS ZEHETMAIR

Violinist, conductor, and founder of the Zehetmair Quartet **Thomas Zehetmair** has continuously received accolades for his wide body of work in the span of over two decades. The Salzburg-born musician juggles the roles of soloist, conductor, and leader of his own quartet, approaching each task with fervor and awareness. Since his debut as a soloist at age 16 and winning first prize in the International Mozart Competition a year later, Zehetmair has developed an impressive career that has been studded with awards and acknowledgements. He took part in the epic 153-CD box set *Bach 2000: The Complete Bach Edition*, makes regular guest appearances with renowned orchestras such as the Chicago, Philadelphia, and Boston Symphony

Orchestras, and has given numerous first performances, including violin concertos written for him by Heinz Holliger and James Dillon.

In 2002, in addition to his solo endeavors and works with his namesake quartet, Zehetmair joined Northern Sinfonia as its Music Director. His post has been met with favorable reviews, and his ability to bring a musical piece to life has permeated not only his playing but his conducting. The *London Times* called "his direction… every bit as inspiring and visionary as his own violin playing."

Zehetmair founded his Zehetmair Quartet in 1994. Their 2004 release of Schumann quartets earned them the Diapason d'Or, *Grammophone*'s Record of the Year Award, and various other prizes and positions on many publications' Best of the Year lists. In its short existence, the Zehetmair Quartet has risen to become one of the most respected chamber quartets on the circuit today.

ZEHETMAIR QUARTET

Conjuring life into every piece of music they perform and capturing audiences "with a display of musical expertise and compelling empathy" (*The Reading Chronicle*), the **Zehetmair Quartet** has reached the top of critical and popular acclaim during its thirteen-year existence. Since its first concert tour in 1998, the success of which resulted in re-engagements by all of the tour's promoters, the quartet has performed in Europe, Asia, and the United States to captivated crowds, often introducing into the American musical palate long-overlooked works by composers such as Schumann, Bartók, Hindemith, and Hartmann. In addition to first violinist and founder Thomas Zehetmair, the group is composed of original member Ruth Killius on the viola and newcomers Kuba Jakowicz and Ursula Smith on the violin and cello, respectively.

Often admired by critics and audiences alike for performing their programs from memory, the Zehetmairs concentrate on one set program each year, cultivating the selected pieces to a high standard of excellence that, contrary to what a limited repertoire might imply, gives each musician more freedom and opportunity to familiarize himself with the music. Indeed, the conspicuously low number of pieces in their repertoire is the foundation upon which

Thomas Zehetmair started the quartet, a reaction to chamber music festivals that often require a musician to absorb a large number of works, resulting in what Zehetmair believed was a compromise in musicianship for the sake of variety. Speaking of his quartet's philosophy behind the necessity of memorizing a limited repertoire, which has occasionally met criticism for what could be construed as its overt showmanship, Zehetmair says, "[playing from memory] allows us to create an even larger overview of the whole piece. We also communicate better because we don't have music stands blocking our view."
