## CAL PERFORMANCES PRESENTS LES 7 DOIGTS DE LA MAIN CIRCUS IN THE WEST COAST PREMIERE OF SEQUENCE 8 FEBRUARY 4–7 IN ZELLERBACH HALL

**BERKELEY, January 8, 2015**—Montreal-based contemporary circus troupe Les 7

<u>Doigts de la Main Circus</u> (translated to "Seven Fingers of the Hand") returns to Cal

Performances with the West Coast premiere of its latest production, *Sequence 8*, Wednesday—

Friday, February 4–6 at 8:00 p.m., and Saturday, February 7 at 2:00 p.m. in Zellerbach Hall.

"A transfixing circus spectacle that boggles both mind and eye" (*Boston Globe*), *Sequence 8*explores unconventional themes—connection, isolation, and alienation—using the techniques and vocabulary of acrobatic arts, theater, and modern dance. Featuring an eclectic music score, from artists C2C and Ben Harper to the Squirrel Nut Zippers and selections from Puccini's opera *Tosca*, *Sequence 8* showcases eight young and athletic artists, who navigate a multi-dimensional set, performing on the trapeze, somersault routines, and in choreography that often satirizes traditional circus arts like juggling and clowning.

Les 7 Doigts de la Main was founded in Montreal in 2002 by seven (hence the seven fingers) artists of varying backgrounds—Isabelle Chassé, Patrick Léonard, Faon Shane, Sébastien Soldevila, Samuel Tétreault, and Bay Area natives Gypsy Snider and Shana Carroll—with the goal of bringing circus to a human scale. To date, the collaborative company has created eight productions that each carry its unmistakable fingerprint, including the acclaimed works, Loft, Traces, La Vie, Fibonacci Project, Patinoire, A Muse, Sequence 8, and Psy, which was presented by Cal Performances in 2013. Les 7 Doigts has earned numerous awards, including the Gold Medal, Silver Medal and Nikouline Trophy (Festival Mondial du Cirque de demain); Gold Medal and Audience Awards (SOLyCIRCO Festival); Argus Award (Brighton Festival); and nominations for two Drama Desk awards. The company has also created work for the Olympic Games in Sochi, Vancouver, and Turin, and for the Broadway musical Pippin.
