SOPRANO <u>SANDRINE PIAU</u> MAKES HER CAL PERFORMANCES DEBUT ON SUNDAY, APRIL 29 AT 3:00 P.M. IN HERTZ HALL

Her recital includes works by some of the greatest composers for the voice: Strauss, Fauré, Mendelssohn, Chausson, Poulenc, Britten and Bouchot

BERKELEY, March 27, 2012—Celebrated French soprano Sandrine Piau brings her silvery voice and unmannered grace to Cal Performances for the first time on Sunday, April 29 at 3:00 p.m. in Hertz Hall. Piau, a distinguished singer in both opera and recital, will bring a program from her critically acclaimed album *Après un Rêve* which features images of night, sleep, dreams and waking in modern song of the 19th and 20th centuries. Included in the program are Poulenc's settings of surrealist poetry, Richard Strauss's *Morgen*, and Benjamin Britten's *The Salley Gardens* and Vincent Bouchot's *Galgenlieder*, an eerie new song cycle, together with some rarely heard Felix Mendelssohn and familiar numbers by Ernest Chausson and Gabriel Fauré. The Guardian praised the album for having a "hypnotic way with words." This is singing that sends shivers down your spine." Piau performs with longtime collaborator pianist Susan Manoff who worked with her on *Après un Rêve*.

Sandrine Piau was born in Paris in 1965. Though initially trained in harp, she studied voice at the esteemed College Lamartine Conservatoire National Superieur de Musique du Paris (Paris Conservatory of Music). Piau first made a name for herself performing Baroque and Classical works, particularly the operatic roles of Handel's *Tamerlano* and *Xerxes* and Mozart's Pamina and Servilla. But in recent years has been growing her stylistic repertoire both in recital and in operatic roles—she received critical acclaim for her portrayal of Titania in Britten's *A Midsummer Night's Dream*. Her repertoire is diverse and includes more recent work by composers such as contemporary French composer Vincent Bouchot, which will be featured in her Cal Performance recital. *The New York Time* has praised Piau for her "expressive voice, nuanced phrasing and immaculate control".

Piau has performed with some of Europe's leading conductors including Marc Minkowski, Christophe Rousset, Gustav Leonhardt, Rene Jacobs, William Christie, Fabio Biondi and Philippe Herreweghe. She has participated in many international festivals such as Festival International d'Art Lyrique, Salzburg Festival, and Covent Garden Festival. A recitalist, she has performs regularly throughout the world, including prestigious venues like Wigmore Hall, Carnegie Hall, Musikwerien Wien and Salle Pleyel.

Her extensive discography is produced exclusively with the French recording company Naïve. Past albums include the complete vocal records of Johan Sebastian Bach with Ton Koopman and the Amsterdam Baroque Orchestra & Choir. Her next album "le Triomphe de L'Amour" is set for release in 2012. She won a the Stanley Sadie Handel Recording price in 2005 and was granted the status of a *Chevalier de l'Ordre des Arts et des Lettres* (Award of Arts and Letter) in 2006 by the French government, an award given to artists who have contributed significantly to their fields. She has 2 Editor Choice awards from Gramophone, along with a "Diamant d'Opera" by Opera Magazine. In 2009 she was awarded "Opera Singer of the Year" by the French music industry awards and the following year her album Between Heaven and Earth won the esteemed MIDEM Classical Album of the Year award. Currently Piau is on a recital tour across America and will be debuting a tour in Japan this season.
