CAL PERFORMANCES ADDS EVENTS IN THREE CATEGORIES TO THE 2012/2013 SEASON: FIRST STAGE FOR FAMILIES, NEW MUSIC AND WORLD STAGE

SINGLE TICKETS ON SALE SUNDAY, AUGUST 5

BERKELEY, JULY 31, 2012—Seven new performances have been added to Cal Performances' 2012/2013 season lineup. First Stage for Families, a series designed to introduce children and their grown-ups to the world of performing arts, continues its second season with performances by the Dell'Arte Company (Nov. 4); Kaila Flexer's Oakland Folkharmonic and Teslim ensembles (Feb. 24); and Trout Fishing in America (Apr. 14). Two Composer Portrait concerts have been scheduled for November. The Calder Quartet will perform works by Conlon Nancarrow; this concert is part of *Nancarrow at 100: A Centennial Celebration* that includes talks, films and other performances presented in collaboration with Other Minds and BAM/PFA (Nov. 3). The works of Esa-Pekka Salonen (Nov. 8) will be showcased in a concert that will preceed Salonen's performances with the Philharmonia Orchestra November 9-11. Lastly, the World Stage series has been expanded with the return of *Voices of Afghanistan* featuring vocalist Ustad Farida Mahwash, *rubâb* virtuoso Homayoun Sakhi and his Sakhi Ensemble (Mar. 2) and the Cal Performances debut by Iran's singer and Grammy nominee Mohammad Reza Shajarian and the Pournazeri Brothers (Mar. 24).

FIRST STAGE FOR FAMILIES

Humboldt County's **Dell'Arte Company**, making its Cal Performances debut, kicks off the First Stage for Families series on <u>Sunday</u>, <u>November 4</u>. A multifaceted company steeped in the traditions of physical theater, the Dell'Arte Company will present its music-infused work *The Fish in My Head*, which incorporates circus arts, comedy routines and musical theater.

Next up are double-bill performances by ensembles headed by **Kaila Flexer**: **Oakland Folkharmonic** and **Teslim** on <u>Sunday</u>, <u>February 24</u>. The Oakland Folkharmonic is a five-piece string band that includes fellow fiddler Shira Kammen. Flexer will also perform with long-time collaborator Gari Hegedus, a multi-instrumentalist and the other half of Flexer's "exotic...spellbinding" (*Billboard*) duo, Teslim. Known for her work in various folk traditions from around the world, including Jewish klezmer music and Turkish folk music, Flexer's concerts will showcase her ensembles' eclectic repertoire, ranging from traditional modal music of Greece, Turkey and the Middle East to medieval music to original compositions by Flexer, Kammen, Hegedus and Ross Daly.

The series concludes with a performance by four-time Grammy-nominated musical duo, **Trout Fishing in America**, on <u>Sunday</u>, <u>April 14</u>. "Embody[ing] a kind of goofball gestalt at odds with the sugary-sweet format of so much other music for the younger crowd" (*The New York Times*), bassist Keith Grimwood and guitarist Ezra Idlet create an eclectic mix of folk and rock music that is family- and kid-friendly.

First Stage for Families series features two Sunday one-hour performances by each company at 11:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. at Wheeler Hall. Tickets are priced modestly at \$10.00 for children and \$20.00 for adults.

NEW MUSIC

The Calder Quartet returns to Cal Performances on Saturday, November 3. The chamber ensemble is known for its eclectic programming that spans genres and centuries, has been "garnering notoriety as a group that can do anything from tackle the pillars of the string quartet repertoire...to perform with the indie band Airborne Toxic Event on *The Late Show with David Letterman*" (WQXR-FM). Consisting of Benjamin Jacobson (violin), Andrew Bulbrook (violin), Jonathan Moerschel (viola) and Eric Byers (cello), the group will perform works by the eccentric American composer Conlon Nancarrow, as part of *Nancarrow at 100: A Centennial Celebration*, presented in association with Other Minds. Nancarrow, frustrated by the limitation of live performance, composed much of his work for player piano. The three day celebration will also include other performances plus a series of talks and films about Nancarrow

(<u>Nov. 2-4</u>). Further details will be available at calperformances.org, <u>bampfa.berkeley.edu</u> or <u>otherminds.org</u>.

As part of a four-concert residency with London's Philharmonia Orchestra, Cal Performances presents a concert showcasing the compositions of Esa-Pekka Salonen on Thursday, November 8. Pianist **Gloria Cheng** and additional musicians to be announced will explore the music of the renowned Finnish conductor and composer. There will also be a talk with Salonen and Cal Performances' director Matías Tarnopolsky as part of this concert.

WORLD STAGE

Voices of Afghanistan, an event featuring vocalist Ustad (Afghan honorific title meaning master) Farida Mahwash, rubâb virtuoso Homayoun Sakhi and his Sakhi Ensemble, returns to the World Stage series on Saturday, March 2. The Sakhi Ensemble consists of Khalil Ragheb (harmonium), Pervez Sakhi (tula), Abbos Kosimov (doyra) and Zmarai Aref (Afghan tabla). They will be celebrating both the past and future of Afghan music with works ranging from sacred to secular and traditional to contemporary.

Mohammad Reza Shajarian and the Pournazeri Brothers make their Cal Performances debut on Sunday, March 24, with an ensemble of twelve musicians. Considered "Iran's greatest living master of traditional Persian music" (Los Angeles Times), Ostad (Persian honorific title meaning master) Shajarian is an internationally acclaimed vocalist and two-time Grammy nominee. Tahmoures and Sohrab Pournazeri are two of Iran's most innovative young composers and principal members of the renowned Shamss Ensemble. Inspired by a new family of string instruments designed and handmade by Ostad Shajarian, the Pournazeris have invented a new and modern Persian music that expands the classical tradition while remaining true to its spirit. These settings of works by Nezami, Rumi and contemporary Iranian poets will allow the "audience to take away an experience where they are touched by...a new culture of Iran" (Sohrab Pournazeri to the Los Angeles Times).
