CAL PERFORMANCES AT UC BERKELEY PRESENTS JAMIE BARTON, MEZZO-SOPRANO, AND JAKE HEGGIE, PIANO SUNDAY, APRIL 3 AT 3PM AT HERTZ HALL

Berkeley, March 8, 2022 — Cal Performances at UC Berkeley presents Jamie Barton, mezzosoprano, and Jake Heggie, piano, on Sunday, April 3 at 3pm at Hertz Hall. Praised by *Gramophone* as having "the sort of instrument you could listen to all day, in any sort of repertoire," Jamie Barton uses her voice offstage to elevate the concerns of women and LGBTQ+ people. She speaks out through her social media presence on topics such as body positivity, diet culture, and social justice issues. In her Cal Performances debut, Barton is accompanied by her longtime friend and collaborator, composer/pianist Jake Heggie (*Dead Man Walking, Mohy-Dick*), in a program featuring selections from their recent recording, *Unexpected Shadows*. Nominated for a 2022 GRAMMY award for "Best Classical Solo Vocal Album," the repertoire on the recording explores the perspectives of the powerful women represented in Heggie's songs and operas. The pair also perform the West Coast premiere of Heggie's *What I Miss the Most...*, a song cycle with new texts by Joyce DiDonato, Patti LuPone, Sister Helen Prejean, Ruth Bader Ginsburg, and Kathleen Kelly.
