CAL PERFORMANCES AT UC BERKELEY PRESENTS SHEKU KANNEH-MASON, *CELLO* WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 1 AT 7:30PM AT ZELLERBACH HALL

Berkeley, September 21, 2023—Cellist Sheku Kanneh-Mason returns to Zellerbach Hall on Wednesday, November 1 at 7:30pm to make his Cal Performances solo recital debut. His concert program of new and familiar works will include staples by Bach, Britten, and Cassadó, alongside music composed especially for him by Welsh composer Gwilym Simcock, English composer Edmund Finnis, and Cuban composer Leo Brouwer. In advance of the performance, Kanneh-Mason will also be featured in a live conversation over Zoom with cellist/journalist Lev Mamuya on Thursday, October 5 at 12noon PST. That event is free and open to the public with registration at *San Francisco Classical Voice*.

Twenty-four-year-old Kanneh-Mason has already achieved considerable international success as a performer, and his recent accomplishments have solidified his status as a musical prodigy. In 2018, he performed a soulful rendition of Schubert's "Ave Maria" at the royal wedding of Prince Harry

and Meghan Markle. His most current recording, *Song*, released in 2022, features a wide range of classical, folk, and pop repertoire, along with Kanneh-Mason's own arrangements and improvisations. His sophomore album, *Elgar*, released in 2020, rose to the top of the UK classical charts and he was honored as Male Artist of the Year at the 2021 Classic BRIT Awards, in recognition of his talent and the impact he continues to make in classical music. Kanneh-Mason debuted at Cal Performances during the 2019–20 season in a recital with his sister, pianist Isata Kanneh-Mason.
