GRAMMY-WINNING PIANIST AND COMPOSER BRAD MEHLDAU IN TWO CONCERTS THIS SEASON

Berkeley, CA, October 9, 2023—Cal Performances welcomes back acclaimed pianist and composer **Brad Mehldau** for two Zellerbach Hall performances this season, demonstrating his mastery and fluency in a wide range of musical contexts. Mehldau first performs on the UC Berkeley

campus with his Grammy-winning jazz trio, featuring longtime bandmates bassist Larry Grenadier and drummer Jeff Ballard, in an evening of original compositions and reimagined jazz standards on Saturday, November 11 at 8pm at Zellerbach Hall. Mehldau returns with the Bay Area premiere of his solo piano composition, 14 Reveries, along with selections from his Suite April 2020 and other works to be announced, on Saturday, February 10, 2024, at 8pm at Zellerbach Hall. 14 Reveries, a Cal Performances co-commission, is an introspective suite that explores the terrain between improvisation and composition and is influenced by French Impressionism.

As a pianist, Mehldau is widely praised for lyricism balanced with heady abstraction and innovation rooted in tradition. His influences and prolific recorded output have ventured into rock, pop, electronic music, bebop, blues, and even spiritual music. Mehldau is also an author, often writing his own liner notes and essays about music. In 2023, he released *Formation, Building a Personal Canon, Part I,* an autobiography reflecting on the first 26 years of his life, in which he shares deeply personal moments and tells tales of his coming-of-age in the vibrant jazz scene of New York City in the late 1980s and early 1990s.

Brad Mehldau has been refining his distinctive approach to jazz piano trio music for more than 25 years, most notably since the 1996 release of his five-album series, *The Art of the Trio*. To date, he has released 12 trio recordings of original compositions and new arrangements of jazz standards and pop songs. The Brad Mehldau Trio with San Francisco native Larry Grenadier and Santa Cruz native Jeff Ballard first performed at Cal Performances in 2006. Now regarded among the great piano trios of jazz history (see also: Ahmad Jamal, Keith Jarrett, Oscar Peterson, Bill Evans), Mehldau's group is praised for its electric chemistry and ability to effortlessly navigate a wide range of stylistic and emotional terrain. In 2007, the trio returned with guitarist Pat Metheny shortly after Mehldau and Metheny's release of their second collaborative album, *Quartet*.

In his second performance of the 2023–24 season, on February 10, Mehldau offers an introspective recital that reflects both jazz and classical influences as well as pop music sensibilities. Mehldau says his new Cal Performances co-commissioned work 14 Reveries "reflects on the interior experience we create from our own consciousness, independently of those around us... a meditation on the space a composer leaves between specific directions in the score that lets the beauty of the music reveal itself as it allows for new discovery." In a review of Mehldau's world premiere performance of 14

Reveries in September, the London Jazz News described it as "a new work which is neither straightforward nor simple, but it is manifestly a very personal and special statement from one of the very great musicians of our time."

Grammy-winning jazz pianist Brad Mehldau creates music that weaves together a host of seeming contradictions—a passion for in-the-moment discovery balanced by a penchant for narrative and structure; a sensibility prone to abstraction and dense counterpoint but also drawn to the tunefulness, simplicity, and directness of a pop song. With 12 trio recordings to his name over more than 25 years, Mehldau in this performance is joined by his longtime bandmates, bassist Larry Grenadier (a San Francisco native) and drummer Jeff Ballard (originally from Santa Cruz), for an evening of original compositions and reimagined jazz standards.
